## ERRORS IN MODERN BIBLE VERSIONS

"Thy word is true from the beginning..."
(Psalm 119:160)

Accurate translations of the Scriptures are not inspired in the same sense as the original autographs in which new revelation from God was supernaturally given, but they carry the inspiration of the originals with them into the new language¹; thus, accurate translations of the Bible are in every sense the word(s) of God. However, this <u>cannot</u> be said of inaccurate translations. Since God, who is the author of Scripture, "cannot lie" (Tit1:2) and "with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning" (Jas1:17), His words will be found to be absolutely true in both the original autographs as well as in accurate translations of them. Translations that contain factual errors or internal contradictions cannot be the word(s) of God.

The King James Version of the Bible is an accurate translation of the original autographs of Scripture into English. One necessary indication of this is the fact that it contains no demonstrable errors or internal contradictions. In contrast, all modern translations contain factual errors and/or internal contradictions, which disqualify them from being the word(s) of God (i.e., Scripture). TABLE 1 provides examples of such errors in some of the most common English translations available today.
